Speaking on the occasion, Randhawa said that the people of the area have brought to his notice about the deteriorated condition of the cremation ground. Randhawa said that the cremation grounds are the last stations of the journey of our lives and the places should be kept neat, clean and with all facilities required.

Termining the cremation grounds as places of utmost importance, Randhawa said, that scores of people gather at the funeral of a person who leaves this world in almost all the seasons of the year and as we witness different weather cycles the facilities needs to be up graded accordingly. Referring to the present soaring temperature the

MLC said that people need a shelter to stand under to save themselves from the heat and similarly they require shelter if it is raining. "Anyone can die anytime and we have to cremate him or her ignoring all weather conditions", Randhawa added.

He directed the authorities to carry out the work on priority basis that includes construction of platforms, pathways, repair of sheds, shelter shed for people etc. He said that the repair would be carried out on an estimated cost of Rs 5 lakh and if required more funds will be provided.

2 Admins of news groups booked for spreading rumors

SRINAGAR, June 5: Police today arrested two administrators of self styled news groups who were involved in spreading rumors about some youth being whistle-blowers of security forces in Awantipora.

A Police spokesman said that Awantipora Police received information through reliable sources that some self-styled news groups viz "Kashmir Zone," "Hamza Hizbi" and "Quick News" have uploaded/circulated photographs of some youth with malicious intention on social networking sites whereby rumors are being spread that the said youth are whistleblowers of Police/Security Forces.

He said the operators/administrators of these self-styled news groups in pursuance of a well

knit criminal conspiracy had spread the said rumors with sole motive to harm the reputation of said youth to defame them and to cause harm to their life and safety.

"A case FIR Number 89/2018 U/S 501, 505 RPC read with 120-B RPC has been registered on the receipt of this information at P/S Awantipora and investigation was set into the motion," he said and identified the accused as Sajad Ahmad, a resident of Frastalbal Pampore and Shahid Ahmad Bhat, a resident of Namalbal Pampore.

"Efforts are being made to identify the other administrators of such self-styled news groups so that they can be booked under law. Process for getting the said self-styled news groups blocked has also been initiated," he added.

JHS deputation meets DyCM, suggests steps for development of Raghunath Bazar

JAMMU, June 5: A deputation of Jammu Heritage Society (JHS) led by its president, Bhuvneshwar Gandotra, today met Kavinder Gupta, Deputy Chief Minister and suggested him various steps for development of Raghunath Bazar.

The JHS president requested the Deputy Chief Minister to promote the heritage of Jammu to make Jammu an independent tourist destination especially in the light of extension of Railways to Katra and subsequently to Srinagar by 2020, besides construction of express corridor from Delhi to Katra via Amritsar by 2020 bypassing Jammu and development of ring road of 56 km from Samba to Nagrota again bypassing Jammu by getting Rs 5 crore sanctioned as initial grant.

A power point presentation was made by ex-president of the society, Baldev Khullar, depicting the vision of the society about development of Raghunath Bazar which mainly includes underground electric cabling, laying of road by using grey coloured 4" Cobble stone, colouring of shutters in one design and signage with similar colour scheme, putting up new lights on poles and the day as well as night view of Raghunath Bazar after development.

Gandotra stressed upon the need of maintenance of ornamental poles, water points (PSPs) and newly laid down pavements during 1st phase of development in Raghunath Bazar. It was suggested that the same should be undertaken by Jammu Municipal Corporation and before that JHS should be taken into confidence.

A reminder was also made to get a trade mark registration for Mubarak Mandi at an earliest for which a representation already stands submitted. It was also impressed upon that Raghunath

Bazar should not be a traffic free zone instead paid parking be re-introduced in Raghunath Bazar by JMC which should be strictly for customers and Traffic Department should be asked to monitor no-parking in Raghunath Bazar by shopkeepers.

Gandotra also suggested that Jammu city should not be declared as heritage city and instead only selected old building be declared as Heritage Buildings with the consent of concerned owners.

Kavinder gave a patient hearing to the deputation members and assured them of taking concrete steps to declare Mubarak Mandi a trade-mark building. He also assured them of necessary steps in other demands and suggestions.

Ajesh Rohmetra, general secretary, Om Parkash Mahajan (chairman) and Anoop Jain (executive member) were also part of the delegation.

DM imposes Section 144 CrPC in Chowgan ground

KISHTWAR, June 5: District Magistrate (DM) Angrez Singh Rana has imposed Section 144 of Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) in the famous Chowgan ground on the request of the police.

By imposing 144 CrPC, the movement of all sorts of vehicles, official or private, four-wheelers, two-wheelers, motorcycles and bicycles and all the ice-cream vending carts has been banned.

The district Police for quite some time is getting complaints from the general public that many people trespass the famous Chowgan ground by illegally taking four wheelers and two wheelers into it. At the same time many ice-creams vending carts

move in the ground where they cause salt pollution on ground which destroys the flora of ground's top layer. The repeated movement of all these vehicles and ice-cream carts has badly damaged the ecology of ground beside putting at risk the life of kids, women and elders who visit the Chowgan in morning and hours. Police on many occasions tried its level best to prevent the entry of these vehicles and bikers, have taken action on isolated cases and also attempted to educate the people especially youth through social media, but the efforts remained wasteful due to non-corporation of vagabonds and violators.

Police finally requested the DM to issue the order under 144 CrPC to ban the entry of such vehicles, rehries and cycles into the ground and the DM has accordingly issued the orders for strict implementation.

Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Abar Choudhary said that the order will be implemented with full force and police will make wide publicity of order through public announcements, mainstream media and social media for three days with the effect from June 7.

He stated that after the complete publicity the police will take heavy action as warranted under law including the registration of FIR against every such person who will take any bike, motorcycles, bicycle or any vehicle private or official into the ground. "All the Government offices including the establishment of forces will be communicated in writing to desist from making the entry of their vehicles into the ground unless legally permitted for special reason", SSP added.

ReT teachers hold protest, demand de-linking of SSA salary
